A RESOLUTION TO: Host a “Night of Listening” Event at Michigan State University

THE ASSOCIATED STUDENTS OF MICHIGAN STATE UNIVERSITY ENACT:

WHEREAS, This past election has created deep divides in our nation, which are reflected on our campus. Such divide presents challenges to make sure that all students feel safe to live, to study, and to feel free express their values. Yet, such divides also present an opportunity to engage students in the political process in a productive and meaningful way; and,

WHEREAS, We, as the undergraduate student government, should work toward creating an environment in which all students can come together to focus on ideas and policies, in hopes of partnering with each other and with their elected officials to work to turn these ideas and policies into a reality; and,

WHEREAS, The goal of a “Night of Listening” is to teach students that it is both their right—enshrined in the First Amendment—and their responsibility to petition their elected officials who represent them, as well as partner with these elected officials to help create the kind of local, state, and national communities they envision; and,

WHEREAS, It is the recognized duty of students at Michigan State University to enhance their education and address the needs and concerns of the student community; therefore, be it,

RESOLVED, The Associated Students of Michigan State University (ASMSU) host a “Night of Listening” inviting elected officials from the local, state, and federal levels to campus to listen as students from various campus populations articulate their visions about how to make our local and national communities safe and productive for all residents of the United States; and further, be it,

RESOLVED, ASMSU will solicit “sponsorship” without financial commitment by inviting various student groups to co-sponsor this event with us, such as including the CORES and COPS groups, the College Republicans & College Democrats, the Center for Service Learning and Civic Engagement, and more.
