A BILL TO: Recognize the Month of April as Sexual Assault Awareness Month

THE ASSOCIATED STUDENTS OF MICHIGAN STATE UNIVERSITY ENACT:

WHEREAS, Sexual violence is an important issue that affects individuals of all backgrounds, with profound impacts on survivors, their loved ones, and the broader community; and,

WHEREAS, The month of April is nationally recognized as Sexual Assault Awareness Month (SAAM), a time dedicated to raising awareness about sexual violence, supporting survivors, and promoting education on prevention efforts; and,

WHEREAS, The MSU Center for Survivors, along with other campus and community organizations, provides essential advocacy, counseling, and support services for survivors of sexual violence; and,

WHEREAS, Recognizing and supporting Sexual Assault Awareness Month will help encourage campus-wide engagement in prevention initiatives, survivor advocacy, and educational programming; therefore be it,

RESOLVED, The Associated Students of Michigan State University shall formally recognize April as Sexual Assault Awareness Month and issue a statement emphasizing its critical role in raising awareness, supporting survivors, and advancing prevention efforts; therefore let it be further,

RESOLVED, That the Associated Students of Michigan State University shall post or repost all events and promotional materials related to Sexual Assault Awareness Month on all social media platforms and share relevant resources including those provided by MSU Center for Survivors.




