

A BILL TO: Recognize Faculty Leaders Who Have Supported and Expanded Open Educational Resources (OER) at MSU

## THE ASSOCIATED STUDENTS OF MICHIGAN STATE UNIVERSITY ENACT:

- WHEREAS, Open Educational Resources (OER) are, "teaching, learning, and research resources that are copyright-free (public domain) or have been released under an open license that permits others to reuse, revise, remix, retain, and redistribute them."<sup>1</sup>; and,
- WHEREAS, Open Educational Resources (OER) come in various forms, including open textbooks, videos, images, course modules, lectures, homework assignments, quizzes, lab and classroom activities, games, simulations, and other resources contained in digital media collections from around the world; and,
- WHEREAS, The high cost of learning materials presents a barrier to students and negatively impacts their success in college. Spending less money on required learning materials is a step not only in making college more affordable and accessible but also equitable; and,
- WHEREAS, The MSU Libraries has supported the expansion of OER at Michigan State University, and has supported faculty in the development and implementation of OER in their courses; and,
- WHEREAS, A number of amazing faculty have worked in collaboration with the library to develop OER materials of their own; and,

- WHEREAS, The efforts of these individuals have been crucial to the support and expansion of OER conversion throughout MSU's campus, producing high quality course materials that meet their curricular needs, satisfy the pedagogical needs of students, conform to a high standard of accessibility, and save students money on course materials. The product of a great deal of careful effort, these exemplary works are openly licensed for others to use or adapt, and many have been adopted by other instructors from around the nation and around the world; therefore be it,
